Aquaculture: the "solution" that doesn't solve

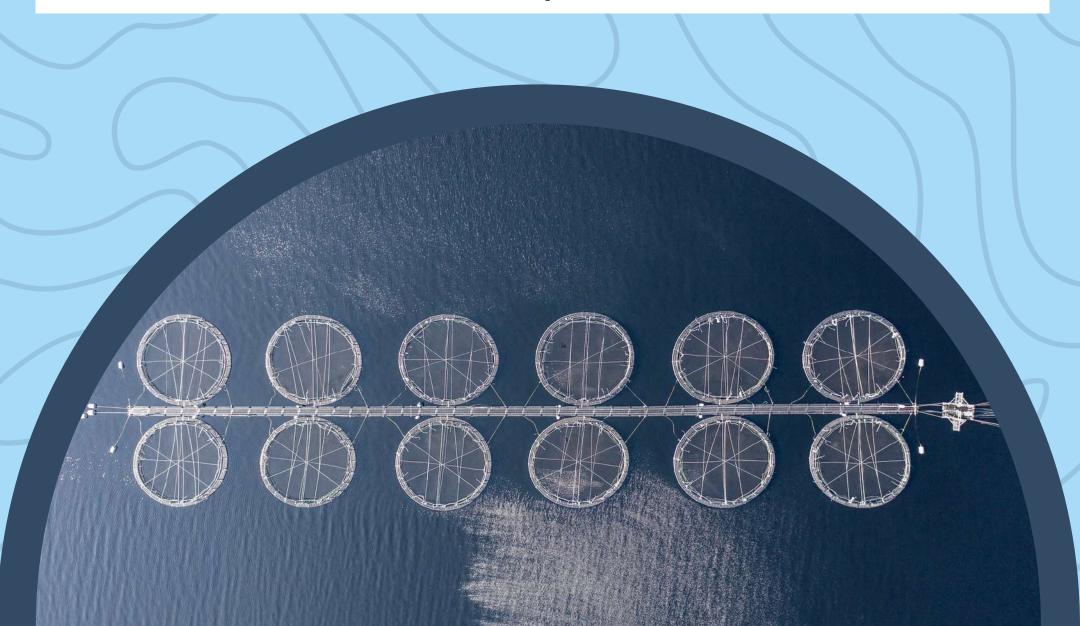


Often presented as a sustainable alternative to industrial fishing, aquaculture hides pitfalls that make it anything but a responsible choice.

THE SOCIO-ECONOMIC IMPACT AND ANIMAL SUFFERING

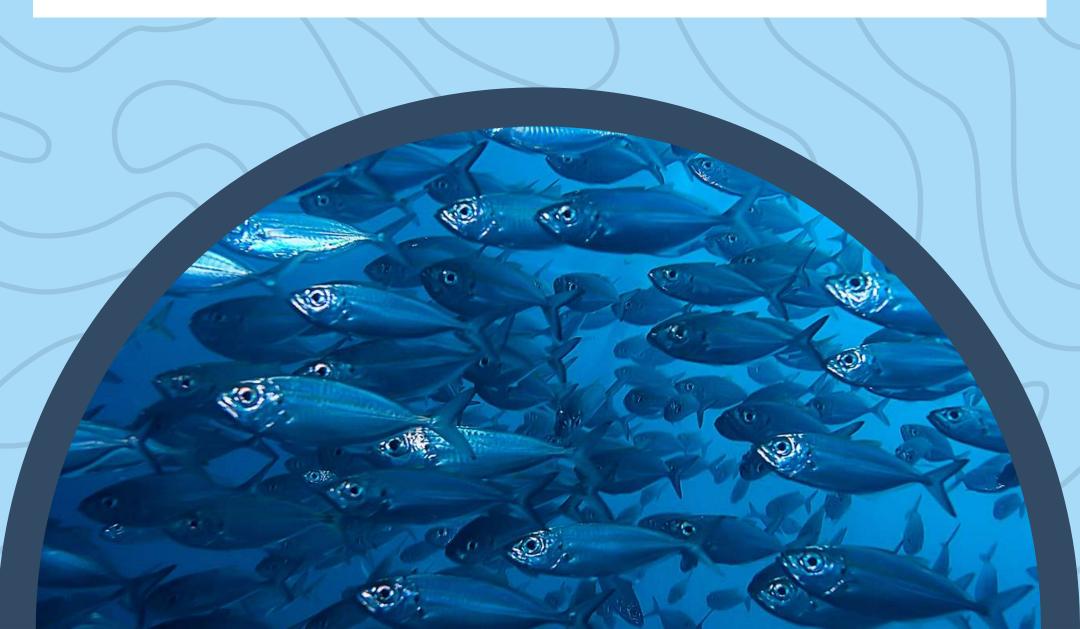
Aquaculture not only damages ecosystems but also threatens coastal communities and dooms animals to a life of suffering.
